2. Background

This report is a statistical snapshot of the joint campaign activities (JDP-NS-2014-02) in the southern North Sea JDP operational area. The report provides summary information concerning the joint control activities that were carried out as from the 6th of January 2014 until the 31st of March 2014.

3. General objective

The general objective of the campaign was to ensure the compliance with the requirements of Commission Implementing Decision 2013/328/EU, the cod recovery measures as specified in Council Regulation (EC) No 1342/2008, and the management measures for sole and plaice as specified in Council Regulation (EC) 676/2007, by means of a coordinated programme of inspections of fishing vessels, at sea and at the ports of landing.

4. Specific objectives

Specific objectives were revised and prioritised by the Technical Joint Deployment Group and included:

a) to inspect vessels and/or catches coming from vessels likely to catch cod, plaice and sole, which have been identified by risk analysis as liable to be in contravention of fishery conservation measures, in particular in the following manner:

- b) control of fishing activities by fishing vessels subject to effort limitations and likely to catch cod as a by-catch,
- c) inspections to identify real-time closure areas and to monitor the compliance with real-time closure areas.

5. Summary of activities

a) Inspections ashore

During this joint campaign period 466 tonnes of demersal species were inspected at landing. In total, there were 152 inspections carried out ashore with 8 suspected infringements reported.

b) Inspections at sea

During this joint campaign period 392 tonnes of demersal species were monitored at sea. In total, there were 220 inspections carried out at sea with 21 suspected infringements reported.
