## 1. Background

This report is a statistical summary of the joint control operations, focused on the demersal and pelagic fisheries that were carried out from the 1<sup>st</sup> of January until the 31<sup>st</sup> of December 2019 in the operational area of the Baltic Sea.

### 2. General objective

The general objective is to ensure compliance with the requirements of Commission Implementing Decision (EU) 2018/1986, Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) No 1396/2014 and Regulation (EU) 2016/1139, by means of a coordinated programme of inspections of fishing vessels at sea and in ports of landing.

#### 3. Summary of activity

#### a) Inspections ashore

During the joint campaign period, 3182 inspections ashore were reported by the MS concerned. The inspection teams detected 82 apparent infringements on 79 fishing vessels. The quantities of fish controlled totalled 60101 tonnes and are presented in Tab. 1 below.

For the period between 1<sup>st</sup> of January and 31<sup>st</sup> of December 2019, MS reported also 917 inspections at sea with a total of 33 apparent infringements detected on 33 fishing vessels. In addition there were 200 inspections reported on fishing traps. The quantities of fish controlled at sea was 5942 tonnes and are presented in Tab. 2 below.

During the reporting period, MS focused the control effort on the prioritised objectives through 7 specific actions. Furthermore, the inspection teams deployed by MS at sea carried out in total 237 observations of species composition in the last haul on fishing vessels operating in the BS JDP area, in order to monitor the compliance with the requirements of the landing obligations. In 2019, MS carried out also 150 inspections on vessels that were on the regional target list.

In 2019, MS deployed 31 inspectors at sea to the joint inspection teams, and 24 inspectors ashore to the mixed inspection teams. Furthermore, two officials from DNK were deployed in the framework of the Baltic Traffic air surveillance operations.

In addition, all MS appointed 13 experts to 2 joint coordination teams located in the EFCA Coordination Room.

The EFCA FPV was operating in the area for 43 sea days with 18 inspectors from the BS MS.
