2. General objective

To ensure compliance with the requirements of Commission Implementing Decision (EU) 2018/1986, Regulation (EU) 2018/973 of the European Parliament and Council, Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 1395/2014 and Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2018/2035, by means of a coordinated programme of inspections of fishing vessels at sea and in ports of landing.

3. Summary

This report is covering the joint campaign activities in the Baltic Sea JDP operational area for fisheries under the scope of the SCIP. The report provides overall summary information concerning the joint control activities that were carried out by air, sea and shore based assets and teams of the participating Member States from 1st of January till 30th of September 2020. Due to the Coronavirus disease (COVID-19) pandemic outbreak, MS have adopted national measures to ensure the limitation of physical contact between their nationals to try to control the spread of COVID-19. This resulted in greatly decreased number of physical inspections at sea and in ports of landing.

a) Inspections ashore

During the 9-month period 1915 inspections ashore took place with an additional 15 transport inspections, and 31 on business premises such as markets. Ninety-five (95) inspections were reported to have taken place on traps and other similar gears, where although in the sea, the inspections originate on the beach with land teams.

b) Inspections at sea

During the first 9 months of 2020, the Baltic MS reported 365 inspections at sea with 6 suspected infringements detected on 4 fishing vessels. Detailed quantities of species inspected are presented in Table 2 below.
