2. General objective

To ensure compliance with the requirements of Commission Implementing Decision (EU) 2018/1986, Regulation (EU) 2018/973 of the European Parliament and Council, Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 1395/2014 and Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) 2018/2035, by means of a coordinated programme of inspections of fishing vessels at sea and in ports of landing.

3. Summary

This report is covering the joint campaign activities in the North Sea JDP operational area for fisheries under the scope of the SCIP. The report provides overall summary information concerning the joint control activities that were carried out by air, sea and shore based assets and teams of the participating Member States from 1st of January till 31st of December 2020. Due to the Coronavirus disease (COVID-19) pandemic outbreak, MS have adopted national measures to ensure the limitation of physical contact between their nationals to try to control the spread of COVID-19. This resulted in greatly decreased number of physical inspections at sea and in ports of landing.

a) Inspections ashore

During this reporting period there were 6598 inspections carried out ashore. The inspection teams reported in total 94 suspected infringements detected.
