## 2. General objective

To ensure compliance with the requirements of Commission Implementing Decision (EU) 2018/1986, and Regulation (EU) 2016/1139 of the European Parliament and of the Council, by means of a coordinated programme of inspections of fishing vessels at sea and in ports of landing.

## 3. Summary

This report is covering the joint campaign activities in the Baltic Sea JDP operational area for fisheries under the scope of the SCIP. The report provides overall summary information concerning the joint control activities that were carried out by air, sea and shore-based assets and teams of the participating Member States from 01<sup>st</sup> of January till 30<sup>th</sup> of September 2022.

The numbers shown in this report have been extracted from the EFCA database according to the activity submitted by the MS within the context of the NS JDP. Only those data that meet certain quality criteria are recorded in the EFCA database. These data are provisional and are kept under continuous review. The extraction of data was done on 5<sup>th</sup> January 2023, for the BS related events, patrols, and targets.

The COVID-19 measures have minimized the exchange of inspectors and the visits by MS experts to EFCA Coordination Centre (CC) due to special COVID sanitary measures of national authorities.

### a) Inspections ashore

During this reporting period there were 2215 inspections carried out ashore, including 17 transport inspections 1 inspection of traps, 18 inspections on other fishing gear and 23 inspections of businesses. The inspection teams reported in total: 54 suspected infringements detected on fishing vessels.

b) Inspections at sea

During this reporting period there were 639 inspections carried out at sea, including 57 inspections on traps and 151 inspections on other fishing gear. The inspection teams reported in total 7 suspected infringements detected on fishing vessels and 7 suspected infringements associated to other fishing gear.

c) Aircraft surveillance

In total, MS reported 318 air sightings during surveillance flights carried out in this period.
