



**PRIVACY STATEMENT IN THE CONTEXT OF
REQUESTS FOR ACCESS TO DOCUMENTS**

<p>WHY AND HOW DO WE PROCESS YOUR DATA?</p>	<p>The European Fisheries Control Agency is committed to respect the right to privacy of applicants when treating requests for public access to documents, and to protect their personal data (i.e. name, contact and any other information that they may provide) in accordance with Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 ¹.</p>

<p>LEGAL GROUND/S</p>	<p>This activity is carried out by the Agency based on public interest under: – EFCA Regulation ², Article 41 (Transparency and Communication) – Decision of the Administrative Board (AB) of EFCA of 27 September 2006, amended by AB Decision 08-I-13(2) – EU rules on public access to documents ³</p>
<p>WHO HAS ACCESS TO YOUR DATA?</p>	<p>Access is provided to the relevant staff members a need-to-know basis.</p>
<p>HOW DO WE PROTECT YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?</p>	<p>A number of technical and organisational measures have been put in place by the Agency. Technical measures include appropriate actions to address online security, risk of data loss, alteration of data or unauthorised access according to the EFCA Information Security Policy. Organisational measures include restricting access to the personal data solely to authorised persons with a legitimate need to know for the purposes of this processing operation.</p>
<p>HOW LONG DO WE KEEP YOUR DATA?</p>	<p>The EFCA will retain your data only for the time necessary to fulfil the purpose and for a maximum of ten years .</p>
<p>YOUR RIGHTS AS DATA SUBJECT</p>	<p>You have the right to access all your personal data, including the supporting documents, and may request them to be updated and rectified, blocked or erased.</p>
