#### 2. General objective

To ensure uniform and effective implementation of conservation and control measures applicable to pelagic fisheries in Western Waters (WW) as specified in Commission Decision 2012/807/EU, by means of a coordinated programme of inspections of fishing vessels, at sea and at the ports of landing, and throughout the whole chain including processing, transport and trade.

#### 3. Summary of activity

This report gathers all the JDP activities between January and June (quarters 1 and 2).

Around 4,922 tonnes of catches of JDP pelagic species were monitored at landing. The breakdown by species as follows:

In total, there were 112 infringements reported out of 1044 inspections carried out at landing.

Around 5,633 tonnes of catches of JDP pelagic species were inspected at sea. The breakdown by species is as follows:
