#### 2. Background

This report is a statistical snapshot of the joint campaign activities (JDP-BS-2014-01) in the Baltic Sea JDP operational area. The report provides summary information concerning the joint control activities that were carried out as from the 6<sup>th</sup> of January 2014 until the 19<sup>th</sup> of December 2014.

#### 3. General objective

The general objective of the campaign was to ensure compliance with the requirements of Commission Implementing Decision 2013/305/EU and the cod recovery measures as specified in Council Regulation (EC) No 1098/2007, by means of a coordinated programme of inspections of fishing vessels, at sea and at the ports of landing.

#### 4. Specific objectives

Specific objectives were established by the BS Steering Group. The Technical Joint Deployment Group (TJDG) prioritised these specific objectives for the different sub-areas.

The following specific objectives were implemented during the joint campaign operations:

 a) to inspect vessels and/or catches coming from vessels likely to catch cod, herring, salmon and sprat, which have been identified by risk analysis as liable to be in contravention of fishery conservation measure,

- b) to carry out cross check of information concerning transport of fish,
- c) to promote, monitor and evaluate the compliance with the requirements of the accurate recording of discards in log-books by masters of fishing vessels.

### 1. Summary of activity

## a) Inspections ashore

During this joint campaign period 3.918 individuals of SAL and 19.400 tonnes of COD, HER and SPR were inspected at landing. In total, there were 2659 inspections carried out ashore with 39 suspected infringements reported. Furthermore, there were 6 transport inspections with no infraction detected.

## b) Inspections at sea

During this joint campaign period around period 317 individuals of SAL and 5.133 tonnes of COD, HER and SPR species were monitored at sea. In total, there were 1.532 inspections carried out at sea with 33 suspected infringements reported.
