#### 1. Background

This report is a statistical overview of the joint control operations that were carried out, as from the 5<sup>th</sup> of January 2015 until the 18<sup>th</sup> of December 2015, in the framework of the northern North Sea (NNS) joint campaign.

#### 2. General objective

To ensure compliance with the requirements of Commission Implementing Decision 2013/328/EU, the cod recovery measures as specified in Council Regulation (EC) No 1342/2008 and the management measures for sole and plaice as specified in Council Regulation (EC) No 676/2007 by means of a coordinated programme of inspections of fishing vessels, at sea and in the ports of landing.

#### 3. Specific objectives

The specific objectives were adopted by the NS Steering Group and the NNS TJDG prioritised control tasks in different operational subareas to meet these specific objectives.

The following specific objectives were implemented during the joint campaign operations:

- a) to inspect of vessels and/or catches coming from vessels likely to catch cod which have been identified by risk analysis as liable to be in contravention of fishery conservation measures,
- b) to promote, monitor and evaluate of the compliance with the landing obligation and the accurate recording of discards in log-books by masters of fishing vessels,
- c) to carry out inspections to identify real-time closures areas and monitor the compliance with real-time closures areas,
- d) to carry out cross checking of information concerning transport of fish ashore.

#### 4. Summary of activity

#### a) Inspections ashore

During this joint campaign reporting period 17.185 tonnes of cod, plaice and sole were inspected at landing. In total, there were 5639 inspections carried out ashore, including 3 transport inspections, with a total of 99 suspected infringements detected on 88 fishing vessels.

#### b) Inspections at sea

During this joint campaign reporting period 1381 tonnes of cod, plaice and sole were monitored at sea. In total, there were 536 inspections carried out at sea with 31 suspected infringements reported on 29 fishing vessels. Furthermore, there were in total 51 inspections carried out with the objective to observe catch composition in a last haul.
