2. General objective

To ensure uniform and effective implementation of conservation and control measures applicable to pelagic fisheries in Western Waters (WW) as specified in Commission Decision 2012/807/EU, by means of a coordinated programme of inspections of fishing vessels, at sea and at the ports of landing, and throughout the whole chain including processing, transport and trade.

3. Summary of activity¹

This report is a statistical snapshot of JDP activity between January and December (quarters 1 to 4).

Around 8,030 tons of catches of JDP pelagic species were monitored at landing. The breakdown by species as follows:
